What's Happening?

Developer update:

- Attached is a notice from Norris Designs representing the owner/developer of the closed landfill at 6800 Kilmer Street. The developer plans a RV storage lot for 300+ vehicles on the property.
- The notice from Norris Designs calls for a Neighborhood Meeting which is an additional requirement from Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE). FRCN asked for the meeting as part of the process for approval of a Voluntary Clean Up Plan (VCUP).
- The meeting presenter is from Terracon, an engineering consulting firm retained by the developer to collect samples of surface water from Ralston Creek, and soil and ground water from the landfill. The focus of the meeting is the environmental aspect of a closed, unregulated landfill.
- Another meeting at a location and date TBD will be hosted by the City Planning Department.
 The focus of the City meeting is the site plan and City requirements.
- FRCN has representatives well acquainted with environmental and engineering information.

Review:

- CDPHE and the City of Arvada are 2 independent and parallel processes for approval of proposed RV storage lot
- Soil, surface/ground water sampling and neighborhood meeting were additional CDPHE requirements not part of the original VCUP submitted/withdrawn in 2022
- o Results of soil/surface/ground water sampling not known
- CDPHE criteria for VCUP application:

"Please understand that the state will only be looking at soil, groundwater and surface water data to determine if the development plans will be protective of human health and the environment. The state will have no say in the zoning or development plans on the site, as this will fall onto the City of Arvada."

 - Plan to attend the meeting on July 25---we need to pack the room with overflow

 - o concerns about methane
 - what examples of heavy equipment use on unregulated landfills
 - o will developer/owner conduct additional sampling in future
 - other environmental concerns of the landfill

The questions we have to ask ourselves are "How will land redevelopment affect present and future environments and will future generations ask ---What were they thinking?"
