

RVC IS OPPOSED TO INCOMPATIBLE DEVELOPMENT ON INFILL PROPERTIES NEAR OUR HOMES AND "NATURAL RESOURCE" OPEN SPACES WHERE WE RECREATE. PLEASE ATTEND THE JULY 25TH MEETING TO STRESS THAT ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS MUST BE ADDRESSED TO PROTECT THE COMMUNITY.

DETAILS:

Meeting presenter is Terracon Consultant representing the current developer. The Terracon project manager will be joined by a top CDPHE representative.

The focus of the meeting is to discuss the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) and the Voluntary Cleanup (VCUP) application for the closed unregulated landfill (aka dump) located at 6800 Kilmer St.

FRCN Goals for meeting:

Pack the Council Chambers with neighbors to demonstrate that folks are interested ----and care--- about environmentally responsible redevelopment of the landfill property adjacent to our neighborhoods and the Ralston Creek.

if we have a full house with City Staff in attendance, our presence will show that neighbors in adjacent neighborhoods and nearby communities will make time to attend a meeting to express concerns about environmental impacts to our community from these types of brownfield developments.

City Staff Project Manager and other Staff will attend meeting and offer this response: "However, I want to emphasize that this meeting is for the VCUP application and staff from CDPHE will be in attendance to answer questions related to their process, etc. since this is their required meeting. Not the City's since we defer to CDPHE. There will be another neighborhood meeting in the future that will be City required that will address a future site plan, minor subdivision, and Comprehensive Plan amendment. And it will have to follow the noticing requirements in the Land Development Code."

FRCN understands the up and down lulls in the redevelopment progress of the unregulated landfill at 6800 Kilmer has affected neighbors in various ways: denial, disbelief, annoyance, frustration, indifference. FRCN understands folks in nearby communities, as well as neighbors enjoying the Ralston Creek Trail, don't want to look at a commercial development. Some neighbors are concerned how commercial redevelopment will affect our wildlife neighbors, the Ralston Creek water system, and how future generations view the commercial development. FRCN's activity in the process is focused on protecting our community.

The meeting on July 25th is an opportunity for all neighbors to demonstrate support for environmentally responsible redevelopment of the landfill and will also show our

interest in the environmental impacts of other brownfield developments coming down the road such as the 60th & McIntyre warehouse project adjacent to Hyatt Lake.

Thanks for your support and we hope to see you on July 25th.

The TSP Will Study the Following Topics


- Existing traffic and capacity
