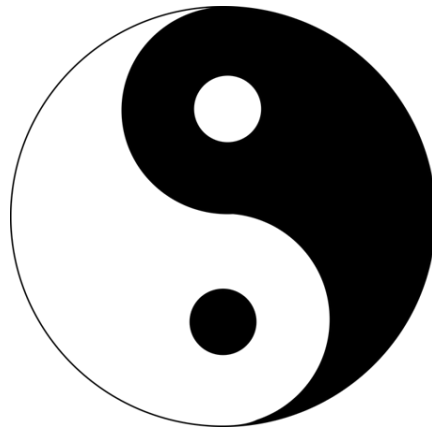


6800 Kilmer St is a closed, unregulated landfill also known as a brownfield

- Brownfields are defined as real properties, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant.
- EPA's [Brownfields](#) program **balances protecting human health and the environment with redevelopment.**

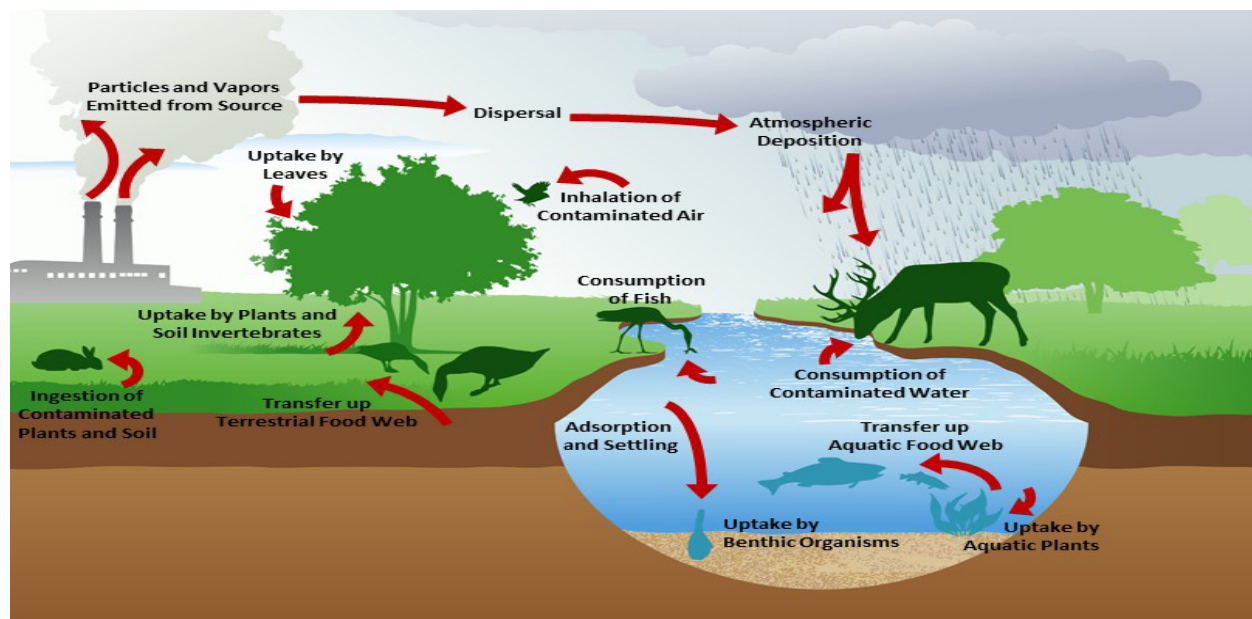

An exposure pathways evaluation considers five main elements:

1. Place where the chemicals originated or were released
2. Environmental fate and transport
3. Specific location(s)
4. Exposure route
5. Estimate of the number of potentially exposed people
