- Redevelopment applications:
  - Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE)--last entry on website in July 2023
- City of Arvada--last entry on etrakit for pre-application on May 2023
- Results of public comments post Neighborhood meeting July 2023--none posted
- Fundraising--GotSneakers? Waiting for November and December payouts--funds used for potential legal fees if necessary; distribution of leftover funds will be considered with community input

- Summary of Activity

  - current developer must submit approved CDPHE application and Army Corps of Engineers(ACE) 404 permit with development application to city staff

  - met with Senator Bennett's staff to express concerns about redevelopment potentially affecting Ralston Creek water
  - attended Mike Griffith's zoom meetings on transportation and affordable housing issues that indirectly align with redevelopment of 6800 Kilmer St landfill
  - contacted area attorneys for alternate advice if necessary

## What's Next?

- research primarily on soil issues---settlement and subsidence
  - soil issues are primary reasons for failed reuse of two previous landfill redevelopments: Rooney Road Sports Complex in Golden and Denver Public Schools(DPS) bus terminal in north Denver; Golden will use Rooney Road fields for solar array and DPS is exploring alternate re-redevelopment; both projects influenced by cost of re-development the 2nd time

    - attached DPS document pp 12, 18, 33, 37 much technical language but high points are uncertainty of "hot spots" and settling/subsidence of subsurface
  - Joyce/Jim Cullen on 66th PI volunteered to research fire safety issues and RV insurance issues <sup>3</sup> ----thank you!

- wait and see---remember, no news is just no news!
- momentum--the issue of redevelopment of the 6800 Kilmer St landfill is overshadowed by the proposed logistic center at 60th and McIntyre; both redevelopments are of interest to local communities with the Kilmer landfill of lesser notice and financial/neighbor support;
  - 6800 Kilmer Street landfill is significant because of unknown subsurface materials/soils/chemicals, proximity to Ralston Creek, lack of historical data on long term effects of heavy equipment storage on an unregulated landfill adjacent to water, incompatibility with attractive re-design areas up creek from site, and social impact on adjacent residential areas---GEOS and Forest Springs and to all neighbors using Ralston Trail for recreation
